

Please DO NOT:

- Attempt repairs or restorations yourself.
- Attempt to clean the mechanism.
- Attempt to remove a jam.
- Attempt to disassemble the slot machine.
- Remove springs.
- Stretch springs.
- Use different springs.
- Remove screws.
- Remove nuts.
- Remove bolts.
- Grease fittings.
- Remove solenoids.
- Remove relays.
- Unsolder connections or switches.
- Use fuses rated a different amperage.
- Attempt to change the payouts.
- Attempt to change the odds.
- Attempt to reprogram the software.
- Change the program chips.
- Touch the clock fan (a rotating mechanism on the base of the machine.)
- Tighten screws. (Certain hardware pieces appear to be "loose". This is to allow metal-on-metal movement.)
- Use a silicone "dry" spray lubricant anywhere on the mechanism, electronics or casing.
- Use a "water-displacement" lubricant type of spray.
- Lubricate payout slides (for mechanical machines.)
- Lubricate the hopper (for electromechanical and electronic machines.)
- Lose the key.
- Become frustrated.
- Take the machine to us! (We will come to you. Sometimes we take the machine back to our shop for in-depth work. It happens, but it is rare.)
